The news coverage in the USA is a tale of two narratives. It doesn't seem to matter what the topic is, or what the evidence is – one group of people loyally follow Trump – while the other criticise him at every turn. For his part, Trump spins only one side of the story and calls everything else fake news.

I have never seen the media so divided. So lined up in one camp or the other. So partisan. This is scary. You would think the news is the news, and the facts are the facts. But it appears not. Increasingly media outlets are telling one side of the news – the side that aligns with their political and social views.

And sadly, this trend is coming to Australia. The media reports of Anglicare's Newmarch House were damning and relentless. I counted over 40 stories with 'Newmarch' in the heading on the ABC website alone. None of them positive. A common formula was interviews with distressed family members.

Contrast this with the outbreak at the Melbourne Islamic school – El Taqwa. By my count, on the ABC website, the school is named in only three headings and appears in seven stories. Sadly, 19 residents died at Newmarch house, and this makes for dramatic headlines. And rightly so. But the Al Taqwa cluster infected 183 persons and is the second biggest cluster in Victoria. It was also newsworthy, I would have thought. But it appears not.



CITY YOUTH RETURNS

Last Friday, saw the return of face to face Youth Group. Our first since March 13th! It was a time of great joy and celebration to be back. I am so thankful to our leaders and to God for the great pleasure that such a ministry is. 2020 HALF YEAR FINANCIAL REVIEW

As we commenced 2020 our Church faced significant financial challenges. During congregational meetings late last year the Wardens presented plans for a solid financial foundation to support sustainable growth in our ministry and - by God's grace, his kingdom. Staff levels were set that reflect these priorities, supported by reliable giving. At the same time we established a five year capital and maintenance plan to care for our properties and the people who use them.

By March it appeared that our plans would face significant challenges as the COVID-19 pandemic forced us to stop meeting together and closed the Café and the Op Shop – two income generating activities. We saw an initial drop in live giving, and anticipated a 40% decrease in overall income!

It is with great thankfulness that we able to say that this dark picture has not become a reality. Our gracious God has been watching over us and has provided for us in ways that we could never have imagined. Giving from our church family has exceeded our budget target over the last three months. For the six months of this calendar year we are only \$2,700 behind target. In addition, in June we received donations of \$42,500 in the Building Fund and \$5,800 in the Religious Education Fund.

We have also benefited from two schemes provided by the Federal Government in response to the pandemic. We have received \$111,000 from the JobKeeper Scheme and \$16,700 from the Boosting Cash Flow for Employers scheme. These schemes will continue until September. We anticipate receiving a total of \$237,000 from JobKeeper and \$42,000 from the Boosting Cash Flow scheme. It appears unlikely we will qualify for JobKeeper beyond September.

As required under the Government scheme, we have had to use some of the JobKeeper money to top-up some staff salaries to a minimum of \$1,500 per fortnight. Yet we have seen savings in other areas such as electricity, cleaning, printing and op shops rents. We continue to work on our capital and maintenance plans. Parish Council also approved expenditure of \$12,000 on items related to the pandemic, mainly focused on online streaming of services etc.

Given the strong giving, the Parish Council has the confidence to proceed with plans to employ a youth worker. We are exploring our options and look to advertise the position in the near future.

We thank every member of our Church family for your commitment, faithfulness and generosity as we have moved through these uncertain times. Thank you for your part in ensuring that we are able to lay a solid financial base on which to build for the future that will enable us to grow God's kingdom here in Dapto.

Our God has been gracious and compassionate to us. He has been watching over us and providing for us and we give Him thanks and praise for this.
