Many hearing that Jesus was back in Bethany and planning to come up to Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover, were eager not only to see him but also Lazarus, who had been raised from the dead. The city was overflowing with pilgrims eager to celebrate one of the biggest festivals on the Jewish calendar. They came out to meet Jesus on the road shouting out the Psalm often sung at this occasion. "Hosanna, Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord". (Psalm 118:26) and they added; 'Blessed is the king of Israel'.

They treated Jesus as a king, though ignorant of the nature of his kingship. Jesus found a donkey and sat on it, as predicted through the prophet Zechariah; 'Do not be afraid, Daughter Zion; see, your king is coming, seated on a donkey colt.'

At that point in time John tells us that everyone, including the disciples, didn't grasp the astonishing truth of their words, and that it would be only a matter of days before the crowd would shout; 'Crucify him, crucify him!!'

Only after Pentecost were their eyes opened through the gift of the Holy Spirit, to grasp the immeasurable grace and mercy of God in the giving of his one and only Son.

May the Holy Spirit work that same work of grace in our hearts and lives this Easter.


CONNECTING WITH FAMILIES

As you may be aware the Federal Government has introduced a number of financial assistance programs for small business, charities and not-for-profit organisations. Some of these are available to churches. We have registered Dapto Anglican's intention to make a claim under the Job Keeper Payment program that was announced on Monday. The Church also qualifies for payments under the Boosting Cash Flow for Employers program that was announced a couple of weeks ago.
