This year in advent we spent a couple of weeks in the book of Judges. It is a sobering snapshot of the history of Israel, and perhaps humanity. They were unfaithful, came under oppression, repented, God rescued them, there was a season of stability, before regression into unfaithfulness.

In Proverbs 21:11 we read "As a dog returns to its vomit, so fools repeat their folly." In Hebrews 3 and 4 we read a sustained reflection on Old Testament Israel. Despite seasons of self-induced trials, and opportunities for a fresh start, Israel's heart remained hard and they missed out on God's gift of rest.

2020 has been testing for us. Assuming 2021 eventually sees something towards a return to normal, what will you have learned? What folly will you avoid? Without being intentional, it is all too easy to drift back into previous patterns. Old habits die hard.
