

CONTROL AND FLOURISHING

Imagine you are a farmer or married to a farmer, hundreds of years ago. Life is a grind, and you are at the mercy of the seasons.

You must plant your crops at the right time. You plant your tomatoes and lettuce in spring and your potatoes and cabbage in autumn. You harvest strawberries and berries in summer, and apples in winter.

You pray for rain. Like the temperature, rain is not something you can control. But you need both for a successful harvest.

You have little control over the soil. You can leave it fallow, and enrichen it with compost scraps. But there are no chemicals, no trucks to deliver loam. The soil of your region determines what will flourish, and what will not. As do the prevalence or absence of local pests and diseases.

In such a scenario, the elements regularly remind you that the world in which you live has an order. You must work out how to farm, what crops to plant, when, so as to conform and survive within that created order.

Now contrast that with modern life. We can control temperatures with hothouses. Or we can import out of season fruits and vegetables overnight by plane. We have watering systems, and hydroponics. We have chemicals, earthmoving and farming machinery. We can adjust the soil's structure and nutrients. Spray against diseases, and so on.

All of this gives us the idea that an abundant farm is something we can simply imagine, and then go out and create. We shape nature – it does not shape or restrain us.

Gender and sexuality are similar. Humanity has for thousands of years understood itself as part of a created order. And that order was instilled into creation, by a creator. Living an abundant life was about getting in tune with the contours and constraints of being human, or married and family life. Living and existing in ways that aligned with God's purposes and intent as it is reflected in his created order.

Science and technology now permit us to imagine a different world. One where we choose, we control, we imagine and then we make it happen, we play god. We shape our own nature, it has no preferences sewn into its fabric by another.

Just because we can imagine it, or even achieve it, does not make it either wise or right. God is still God. We are still creature, in his creation.




MOTHERS UNION

Planting, watering, reaping, enjoying...

We are enjoying the produce from our vege patch. Last year we had a season of plagues: caterpillars, moths, untimely frost, a burrowing "bicho" (insect), birds, and a flood. We despaired of harvesting anything! As we have less than 4 months left in Chile (God willing!!), we feel that this is a metaphor of some of our experiences over the years. There have been times when it seemed the CEP was being afflicted by various plagues, both internal and external. But through it all, Holy Spirit has kept us watering and fertilising and weeding and plucking off the caterpillars. Others cleared the ground and dug out rocks before us, some planted and we followed, sometimes getting quite dirty in the process. But as we get ready to pass the secateurs on, we have been so blessed by the Lord to see a decent harvest and a steadily growing vine. The students' disposition to learn and grow, even under such difficult conditions as Chile is experiencing, is testament to the work of the Holy Spirit. Jo has even had students thank her for the homework exercises that have reminded them of gospel truths and strengthened their faith!

Thank you for your prayers for a flight! In a very quick answer after months of uncertainty, we have flights booked for 21st July, quarantining in NZ!

Please pray the flight will not be cancelled, and for negative PCR tests in the days before we leave. Pray that the students will continue to seek the Lord's wisdom and strength.

So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. He who plants and he who waters are one, and each will receive his wages according to his labor. For we are God's fellow workers. You are God's field, God's building.

Since then, things have become really complicated. A long and complicated story short: we managed to get Julie, Annika & Elissa on to a repatriation flight out of Los Angeles at the last minute. They have now completed their quarantine in Howard Springs in Darwin and are back in Sydney. Gary remains in lockdown in Santiago with a flight scheduled for the 1st of May - just a few weeks to sell/give away/throw out/ship to Australia everything we own and hand over his classes. But apparently a city wide lockdown wasn't complicated enough so Gary contracted COVID19. After 10 days, it appears that he will recover, thanks be to God. But Chile has also closed their borders which complicates things a bit more, with more online forms to fill in and other complications to overcome. It has not been a the way we had hoped to finish up here as we have not been able to say proper farewells to people. It's all just ... complicated.
